Does your home need to be repainted? Sticky-note reminders to repaint go out in January 2014

Is the paint on your home discolored, streaking or fading? Is the trim, or fascia, peeling, flaking and fading? If you answered yes, then it's time to repaint your home.

Many homes in Parkwood Ranch are more than 10-years old, and are showing signs of age. From stucco needing repair to peeling paint on the trim, it's time for homeowners to begin painting their homes.

In January 2014, the Association will begin leaving residents sticky note reminders to paint their homes. As a homeowner in the Parkwood Ranch Community Master Associa-

tion, you have agreed to maintain your home and property according to the CCRs and Architectural Design Guidelines. Save time and avoid the hassle of violation notices by planning to repaint your home in the next few months.

Before painting, homeowners must get pre-approval and must submit an architectural request form. To make it easier to repaint your home, pre-approved paint colors can be found at www.rcoalition.com/pkwpaintcolors.htm.





Please note you must still submit for approval, but by choosing from the pre-approved color combination schemes, it will take only one business day to receive the green light to repaint your home.

At the August 2013 meeting, the Board voted to require homeowners to paint their doors the same color as the body/base or trim of their home. Please keep this in mind when choosing your paint colors.

There are many painting contractors to choose from: Be sure to check with the Better Business Bureau and neighbors for the names of reputable painters.

It's Christmas break - do you know where your kids are?

Vandalism and graffiti usually rise during the holiday school break. Parents are reminded of the City of Mesa curfew laws for minors. They are:

- Minors age 16 and under have a curfew of 10pm;
- Minors ages 16-18 have a curfew of Midnight.

Exceptions to this curfew include minors who are with a legal guardian or parent, as well as

those participating in a school, civic or church activity, going to/from work, or with permission from their legal guardian/parent.

Minors and their parents will be held criminally and financially responsible if they have vandalized any Association property. In the past several weeks, damage has occurred in several areas of the community, including picnic tables and

ramadas in Farmdale Park; play structures in several parcels, and along common walls. Parkwood Ranch will be stepping up the regular off-duty police patrol during winter break to help mitigate vandalism.

Parents, please keep tabs on your children over the holiday break to ensure everyone has a safe, fun and pleasant break from school.

Feral cat population on the rise in Parkwood Ranch

The feral and abandoned cat population has been steadily rising in the community. If you are feeding free-roaming, wild or feral cats you cannot catch, help is available. The Spay and Neuter Hotline (SNH) provided by the Animal Defense League of Arizona has a Trap-Neuter-Return (TNR) program for feral cats.

TNR is the most humane and effective method for stabilizing the feral cat population. Cats are humanely trapped in a

"TruCatch" box trap, then spayed and neutered by a veterinarian. The cat's left ear is "tipped" to identify the cat as fixed, the universal identifier of a sterilized homeless/street/feral cat. The animal is then returned to the neighborhood it lives in.

Weekly clinics are held all throughout the Valley to help stabilize the free-roaming/feral cat population in the greater Phoenix area.
